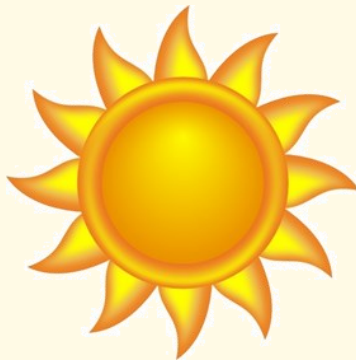


St Anthony's Newsletter
