We were thrilled to celebrate World book Day and Reading throughout the past week. Children and staff members looked fabulous dressed as their favourite characters and we thoroughly enjoyed hearing of all the books that were being celebrated. On Monday and Tuesday, FOSTAS kindly paid for World Book Day Storybook Workshops and a West End theatre group facilitated drama workshops with each class. The children were very enthusiastic about the workshops.

Miss Yohuno is continuing to celebrate reading and storytelling by running two competitions until 16 March. Children can create a story in a box and/or write a 100-word story. Please encourage your child to take part as we all know the power of reading and storytelling.

Please remember that children will copy the adults in their home and if they do not see you read then they will be less likely to read themselves.

Southwark Caritas (inaugural Mass)


